## To Award or Deny Speed and Drive Points?

Recently I asked for some suggestions or hot button topics on our facebook page that beaglers would like to see addressed in this column. One of those suggestions was to address speed and drive. Specifically, how far a dog may be off the line in order to award or deny line points. It's a topic that has and will always come with some debate. Nevertheless, it is one that has been addressed numerous times in this column throughout the years and UKC has not wandered from their position on the topic. The related question and answer were pulled from the archives as addressed in the Rabbit Hunter on page 53 of the October 2002 Issue. I've added a couple personal remarks at the end as well.

**Archived Question:** I was on a cast and all of the cast members got into a discussion on how close a dog has to be to a line to be scored Speed and Drive points. Everyone's opinion differed on this subject. Some people said they want to see the dogs right on the track, and others said three or four feet was close enough. How close do the dogs have to be to the line to be scored on Speed and Drive?

**Archived Answer:** You will never get me to give a foot measurement when scoring a line. There is no rule that says how far off a line a dog can be or how close it has to be and still get scored on Speed and Drive. I sincerely hope there is never an exact distance placed on Speed and Drive in the rulebook. Why, you ask? We already have to carry a stopwatch and, for some of us, that is hard enough to run. Do you want to carry a tape measure too? I certainly don't.

Rule 15(b) states the following:

**"Speed and Drive:** *Dogs to pursue rabbit as fast as scenting conditions allow but must exhibit good line control. Dog(s) observed to be "running rough," "cutting," or "slashing" on track will be scratched on second offense. Rough Running is defined as attempting to run the front of the pack faster than scenting conditions allow or without regard for the actual line. Routinely overshooting turns leading pack mates astray. Cutting is defined as attempting to run the front by leaving the trail to head off pack mates or avoiding heavy cover and other obstacles. Slashing is defined as running in a hit or miss fashion as a result of gambling and without regard for the actual line. Judge to score dogs on speed and drive as rabbit is circled and seen by a cast member. Dogs to be scored as they trail through the line at the approximate location that rabbit is seen. It must be obvious that a dog is NOT trailing in order to deny the dog on Speed and Drive."*

The key quotes in this rule when answering this question are "approximate location," and "It must be obvious that a dog is NOT trailing in order to deny the dog Speed and Drive." If

you read this like I do, you will see that there is no measurement to score dogs on Speed and Drive. They have to be in the "approximate location" and it has to be obvious that the dog is not trailing before you don't score them. Basically, what it comes down to is "is the dog trailing or not?" It is the Judge's decision on every line, and every line is different. Weather conditions, tracking conditions, etc., have to come into the decision. You also have to look at what the rest of the cast is doing. If all four dogs come through a line five feet off and don't miss a beat, how can you not score them? If three dogs come through five feet off and another ten feet, I would say the one ten feet off shouldn't score. Each and every line is different. A Judge has to have common sense and know what a rabbit dog is supposed to do. I sometimes say (and

I mean it nicely), "If you cannot tell if a dog is trailing when they come through a line, maybe you should let someone else judge."

**Allen's Remarks:** In today's rulebook, rough running, cutting, slashing, speed and drive and other related topics are found under section 9, starting on page 38. The parts of the rules that the archived author keyed in on in his answer was "approximate location" and "it must be obvious that a dog is NOT trailing in order to deny the dog speed and drive".

At some point along the years, "approximate location" has been removed for reasons unknown to me. I could only assume that the word "approximate" may have only added to distance debates but who knows. The wording now reads *{Speed and drive points are awarded in the order that dogs pass through the line, splitting points when positions cannot be determined. It must be obvious that a dog is NOT trailing in order to deny the dog Speed and Drive points.}*

For good reason, Todd Morgan stayed clear from suggesting any type of distance in his article when it comes to scoring lines. We would be negligent to the sport and in the name of scoring dogs most accurately to come to a better conclusion, still today nearly 20 years later. There are simply far too many variables that come into play.

Fact is; good vs bad scenting conditions do often make a difference in how far a dog may run off the actual line. Terrain, dry, wet, hot, cold, temperature, humidity, wind, uv rays, barometric pressure and more play more of a part in how dogs are able to trail then many may realize. You can find scientific information on how scent actually works and how variable conditions affects our dogs trailing scent. It's quite amazing actually. Some of the most interesting information I've found involves police canines and all the studies they have done in that field over the years. Combine variable scenting conditions info with how a hounds' nose works and the way the canine processes everything, you can learn so many things that will make your head spin and make one look at scent hounds and tracking a little different. If you dig into some of this information, you'll also find how scenting conditions can and will change significantly throughout the course of a day.

While most of us aren't scent experts, we've all seen days where tracking conditions were terrible, and we've all had days where tracking conditions were outstanding. I've told the true story of watching a hound run a hare who was way off the line as he carried the pack past me and made the turn well before the track did and carried it out in a dominating boss-man manner. While he was way off the line, he OBVIOUSLY without

a doubt had the scent in his nose and never missed a lick in the span of 75 yards of me watching in awe. He was so far off the line that most would not believe it unless you saw it, and even then, I'm not sure anyone would have given him line points had it been a competition, but he most certainly would have deserved them. That IS the most extreme case of being so far off the line I've ever seen, but it got my full attention and made my jaws drop at the wonders of a dogs' nose.

The opposite of the above is where we've seen game and put hounds right on top of what should have been a red-hot track only to have them not be able to run the track. And sometimes maybe even where the dogs acted like they could not smell anything. The point is, we can learn a great deal about hounds and how to read them simply by watching and listening them work over time. A hounds' actions and body language will generally speak for them, on many different levels including whether or not the dog is obviously NOT trailing when going through a line.

At the end of the day, in the Hunting Beagle format, dogs are not required to straddle the track but rather run the track to the best of their abilities. Under good scenting conditions, you'll see them work nicely off the actual line while in other scenting conditions you'll see them having to dig down harder and work closer to the line. Whatever the distance from the actual line the dog can capably run the given track should be the same criteria for scoring lines on that track.

All that said, we're better served to allow judges to use good judgement and common sense when making decisions on whether or not to score a dog on line. We know what the applicable rule states. ***{It must be obvious that a dog is NOT trailing in order to deny the dog Speed and Drive points.}***

Watch the dog and let the dog tell you if it meets the criteria to be scored or not. I'm fairly certain that if you are out there looking to buy my dog, you'll have no trouble deciding whether my dog should be awarded line points or not.

**When to Call the Next Line After All Dogs Missed the Line**

**Q:** A line is called, and all dogs miss the line (none scored on it). At what point are these dogs once again eligible for speed and drive scoring? Is it at any next available spot where the rabbit can be marked or wait until they complete the next circle?

**A:** Let's change the scenario just slightly by saying Dog A did score on this marked line but B, C and D did not. Unfortunately for three of them they will not have another opportunity until they bring the rabbit back around again, right?

The very same theory applies when all dogs miss a marked line. Although the rulebook does not specifically answer this question the UKC maintains that the next opportunity to score speed and drive is not available until the dogs complete another full circle.

**Substitutions at World Championship**

**Q:** If the dog that I entered in the Hunting Beagle World Championship comes in heat, can I substitute another dog for that dog?

**A:** Yes, and no. The rules for the World Championship state that you can substitute any dog that is sick, injured, in heat or dead, with a dog in the same owner's name. The rules further state that only dogs that qualified at a World Qualifying Event for that year are eligible to compete in the championship. So, yes you can substitute any dog that is permanently registered in your name (or co-owned) so long as it is also qualified.

### General Information

Points can be earned for both hunt and bench show competition accomplishments. Points earned in Hunt and Bench Show will be included in the Youth Handler's total points earned. However, Bench Show points are limited to not exceed the number of hunt competition points earned when the total is determined at the end of the calendar year. Note: This is not a rule for each individual event. It's a rule that only affects the final total points awarded at the end of the calendar year.

Example: John Doe Jr.: year-end Hunt points total = 75; year-end Show Points Total = 100; year-end Total Points Earned = 175. Result: Net Point Total = 150.

Any Youth Handler may compete with no more than two dogs in a hunt and or a show on the same day. The dog(s) they compete with in the hunt do not have to be the same dog(s) they compete with in the show. The dog they compete with is not required to be a dog that is registered to the youth as the owner.

Points may be earned throughout the calendar year (January 1-December 31). Standings will be updated monthly and published on the UKC website and in *American Beagler* magazine.

### Youth Handler Responsibilities

Whenever a youth is handling more than two different dogs in a hunt or more than two different dogs in a show, it is the youth's responsibility to clearly advise the entry takers, at the time of entry, which two dogs they are competing with for Series Points.

### Event Officials Responsibilities

It is the responsibility of the event official (Master of Hounds and Bench Show Judge) to complete the First Strike Youth Series Results Form that is included with the Event Report. That form must be sent to UKC along with the Event Report. If there were no youth participating in the event that day, the event officials should indicate it as such on the form and include it with the Event Report regardless.

### Award Winners

At the end of the year, there will be three winners recognized in each age division. The highest total net points earned will be the Gold Champion. The second highest total net points earned will be the Silver Champion. The third highest total net points earned will be the Bronze Champion. The winners will be recognized and receive their awards each year at the Beagle Nationals Awards Ceremony.

## ⚡ PURPOSE ⚡

The UKC Clash of Champions was developed for UKC hunting Beagles. It is the result of UKC and the UKC Chartered National Hunting Beagle Association (NHBA), working together to offer Beagle hunters a new pursuit and unparalleled prestige. NHBA will continue with their own Hound of the Year series. The UKC Beagle Clash of Champions replaces the previous UKC year-long Beagle race, called the All-Star Series. Enter: The UKC Clash of Champions! This hunt is designed to boost entries at local clubs by requiring five cast wins at UKC Licensed Hunting Beagle Events to qualify. The payout is generated through a \$5 per dog event fee and the total payout is guaranteed by UKC. The Clash of Champions program is herein further referred to as the COC.

## ELIGIBILITY

Dogs eligible for the COC are those that earned a minimum of five cast wins, towards the dogs' UKC championship degree, throughout the previous calendar year. Cast wins may be earned at any UKC licensed Hunting Beagle Event. Dogs must be permanently registered with UKC to be eligible for entry to the COC.

## REGIONAL RUNOFFS

The first leg of the COC is the regional runoff. Qualified dogs may enter any one of the four strategically placed runoff locations, to be determined and announced later. Owners may select any region they choose to enter. All four regional runoffs will be held on the same weekend.

The regional runoff is an elimination format. Owners will have the option to enter in Round 1 (a) and or Round 1 (b), allowing handlers to handle multiple dogs. A cast win in Round 1 will count towards the dogs' degree. A total score of plus points is not required to advance in any portion of the COC.

All entries for the COC are advanced entries only. Owners in good standing and who have paid their membership dues to the National Hunting Beagle Association (NHBA), for the qualifying calendar year, will receive a discounted entry fee of \$25. Otherwise, the entry fee is \$50. This entry fee covers the regionals all the way through the COC Finals. The NHBA's top eight hounds in their final standings at the end of the calendar year are eligible for a first-round bye in the regional runoff.

Round 1 (a) and Round 1 (b) at the regions will be 90-minute hunts. All subsequent rounds will be 60-minute hunts. A total score of plus points is not required to advance to any round.

Two telemetry systems, two dog boxes, and one jacket are awarded to the top four finishers in each of the four regions, provided by UKC and NHBA.

## CLASH OF CHAMPIONS FINALS

A total of 32 dogs will advance from the four regions to the COC Finals, to be held on Thursday at the UKC Hunting Beagle Nationals. The number of dogs advancing from each of the four regions is pro-rated, based on the total entry and the number of dogs entered in the region. EXAMPLE: A region with 80 dogs entered will advance

twice as many to the finals as compared to a region with 40 entries.

Each round will be a 90-minute hunt with non-hunting judges. A total score of plus points is not required to advance to a subsequent round. Round 2 will feature braces in each of the four casts. A cast win in Round 1 will count towards the dogs' degree.

## 2022 PAYOUT

A grand total of \$35,000 is guaranteed to be paid out to those 32 hounds advancing to the Clash of Champions (COC) Finals as follows:

1st Place	<b>\$10,000</b>
2nd Place	<b>\$5,000</b>
3rd Place	<b>\$2,500</b>
4th Place	<b>\$1,500</b>
5th – 8th Place	<b>(4)\$1,000</b>
9th – 32nd Place	<b>(24)\$500</b>

## ENTRY INFORMATION

A UKC Clash of Champions Invitation is mailed to the first named owner of a dog who has earned five cast wins during the same calendar year, after the qualifying year and all wins are processed by UKC. The Invitation will include instructions for the owner to complete and submit an official entry to UKC, along with the entry fee, for entry into the UKC Clash of Champions. Advanced entries only are accepted. The official entry form will note the deadline entry date for the event.

To enter the 2022 UKC Clash of Champions, the entrant for each qualified Beagle must:

- Submit a completed Official UKC Clash of Champions Entry Form
- Pay the entry fee
- Be in good standing with UKC
- Be a resident of the United States

Entry fees are non-refundable with the following exceptions: a written statement received by UKC from the owner on or before the Region Event date, reporting; 1) a deceased dog; 2) injured dog (must include vet statement); or 3) a female in season.

## SCORING QUESTIONS, RULINGS AND APPEALS

All handlers are held to the procedures and timelines, as outlined in the UKC Hunting Beagle Rulebook, when questioning a judge's call or a call

that was not made. The portion of that procedure which states; {Situations not questioned and notated at the time Judge's decision is made, will not be considered}, will be enforced with no exceptions. By entering the UKC Clash of Champions, you agree to abide by these rules and decisions of any ruling made by the Master of Hounds, which will be determined in UKC's sole discretion. Failure to comply with any published rule is grounds for immediate disqualification.
