## Points, Ties, & Questions

### Tree Points

- 1<sup>st</sup> 100
- 2<sup>nd</sup> 40
- 3<sup>rd</sup> 25

### Split Points

- 1<sup>st</sup> + 2<sup>nd</sup> 70
- 1<sup>st</sup> + 2<sup>nd</sup> + 3<sup>rd</sup> 55
- 2<sup>nd</sup> + 3<sup>rd</sup> 35

### Squirrel Caught on Ground

No points for dogs not declared treed.

### TIES

*All ties to be broken in the following order.*

1. Most plussed first tree points.
  2. Most plussed second tree points.
  3. Least number of minus points.
  4. Most circled points.
  5. If still a tie, dogs involved will continue to hunt until a dog is called treed or a dog is scratched or withdrawn.
- The tree score will determine the winner.

### Procedures for Questioning a Call

#### #1 BE REASONABLE

Situations not questioned and notated at the time Judge's decision is made WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED.

- 1) Ask for a cast vote. It takes a majority to overturn the judge. If you are still not satisfied and the handler is confident a rule has been misapplied or violated,
- 2) ask the judge to put a question mark on the scorecard.

If the event is being run under a Hunt Director format, a fee is required for a question, to be refunded if the panel rules in favor. That current fee amount is noted on MOH/HD checklist.

### Scorecards

Scorecards must be completed in the woods, and no changes can be made later except where a question arises and is noted in the woods.

Handler's signature verifies hunting time, and scores are correct. Any protest related to time or scores must be noted with a question mark.

## Times

### 1 Minute – Treed Dog(s) Requirement

When a dog is declared treed, dog must bark at least once every minute. (If only one dog in cast or one dog remaining in cast, dog must still hold tree for 2 minutes.)

### 2 Minutes – Tree Closes, Hold Tree

After the two minutes has elapsed, the tree is considered closed, and no other dog may be declared treed on that particular tree.

When a dog is declared treed by the handler, the dog must hold the tree for 2 minutes, unless all dogs are declared treed or handled or hunt time expires. One of the dogs declared treed must bark at least once every two minutes. (If only one dog in cast or one dog remaining in cast, dog must still hold tree for 2 minutes.)

### 5 Minutes – Search Time

When dog is declared treed, dog must be handled and five minutes may be used to search a tree. A squirrel may not be scored otherwise.

### 10 Minutes – Time-Out Walking to Trees “if”

If all dogs are declared or are on leash time out shall be called after ten minutes of hunt time has been used walking to trees. Time is back in while searching the tree.

### 15 Minutes – Not Hunting

Dog is scratched for failing to make an attempt to hunt within any 15 consecutive scorecard minutes.

If new ground must be found to finish cast and more than 15 minutes is required or have to move to new area by vehicle, call time out immediately.

### 30 Minutes – Delay of Cast, Questioning Score or Placement

Dog is scratched for delaying completion of the cast, after time out was called, and the handler has not returned to the cast.

Any owner or handler questioning a dog's score, or event placement, must do so not later than thirty minutes after the posted deadline to return scorecards.

## Other Quick Tips

### 30 Steps (90 feet)

Game must be in tree dog is on in a coon hunt or in a tree within 30 normal steps dog is on in a squirrel hunt.

Dogs treed apart 30 steps, are to be considered split treed. If dogs split tree less than 30 steps and each tree contains game, they are to receive separate tree points regardless of the distance between trees, provided the game is in the tree that the dog is treed on.

When game is treed in a hole or nest and not seen. Nest or hole must be within 30 steps (90 feet) of tree that dog is treed on to be circled. Trees not containing game, and with no nest or den within 30 steps will be deleted.

### Timbering

Plus points may be awarded when squirrel is seen timbering from tree to tree or on the ground and the dog is moving with the squirrel.

### Stationary Rule

Any dog continually barking in the same place for a period of two (2) minutes will be scratched, unless called treed. If a dog should pause for more than one (1) minute or leaves the area, break the stationery. If the stationary rule is being applied to a dog and another dog is called treed, the stationary rule will be broken. No stationary rule to be applied once a dog is declared treed on that tree. If judge is heading to or in the process of scoring another tree, the stationary rule shall be stopped. Anytime the stationary rule is running and dog(s) stops barking, the one (1) minute rule should be applied. Should stationary rule expire before one (1) minute expires and dog resumes barking, handler(s) should be permitted to make a tree call provided call is made within the next three barks the dog makes. If dog is not actively treeing on a scorable tree, no action should be taken. Do not scratch dog on fence, in a hole or other place of refuge other than on a tree.
